## What do the test questions look like?

The OSSLT consists of a total of 33 questions.

- 31 multiple choice questions(e.g. Drag and drop, drop down menu, checklist
- 2 open-response questions (100 words and the opinion writing is 500 words)
- Each session is designed to be completed in 60 minutes and students complete each session in one sitting
- After the two test sessions, students will answer a student questionnaire

#### What can students have access to during the literacy test?

During the test, students can have access to the following:

- A Chromebook will be provided with specialized software
- Wired headphones for listening to questions and readings
- pen or pencil and paper for rough work
- Extra time
- If you have an I.E.P., speak with your SERT for accommodations




#### Short Answer Responses: Code 0, 10, 20, 30
